

# Chhattisgarh: Home Minister Amit Shah Launches Next-Generation CG Dial-112 Service, Mobile Forensic Vans In Raipur

Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Monday launched Chhattisgarh Police's next-generation CG Dial-112 emergency response service and a fleet of mobile forensic vans at Mana Police Parade Ground in Raipur.

In the presence of Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai and Assembly Speaker Raman Singh, the Union Home Minister flagged off 400 advanced Dial-112 emergency response vehicles and 32 mobile forensic vans aimed at strengthening emergency services and scientific investigation across the State.

with smartphones, GPS systems, wireless radios, PTZ cameras, dash cameras, mobile NVR systems and solar backup facilities, enabling live monitoring, real-time tracking and faster communication during emergency response operations.

The service will operate round the clock using GIS-based monitoring, advanced vehicle tracking systems, SIP trunk technology and automatic caller location identification. All 33 district coordination centres in the State have been connected to the network. Citizens will also be able to seek assistance through voice calls, SMS, email, web portal, WhatsApp, chatbot

services and the SOS-112 India mobile application.

The 32 mobile forensic vans launched under the theme "Science on Wheels - Towards Faster Justice" are aimed at strengthening evidence-based investigation across the State.

Introduced with the objective of "32 vans, 32 districts, one commitment: accurate investigation and faster justice", the initiative will allow preliminary forensic examination directly at crime scenes.

Each van, built at an estimated cost of around ₹65 lakh, is equipped with crime scene preservation kits, evidence

collection and sealing tools, fingerprint detection systems, narcotics testing kits, digital forensic support systems, high-resolution photography equipment, bullet hole screening and ballistic examination kits, along with gunshot residue (GSR) testing facilities.

Until now, transporting evidence from crime scenes to laboratories has often caused delays and increased the risk of contamination. With the deployment of mobile forensic vans, preliminary examination, evidence preservation, testing and digital documentation can now be carried out on-site, improving both the speed and quality

of investigation.

The initiative aims to strengthen scientific investigation systems, promote evidence-based justice delivery and ensure transparent, time-bound and reliable criminal investigation. The integrated Dial-112 service and mobile forensic units are expected to improve emergency response capabilities and further strengthen public confidence in law enforcement and the justice system.

Deputy Chief Minister and Home Minister Vijay Sharma, Director General of Police Arun Dev Gautam, MLAs, public representatives and senior police officials were present on the occasion.

## Gold Worth ₹9 Crore Seized from Car in Mahasamund; Three Youths Arrested

Mahasamund .In a major operation conducted during a routine vehicle inspection, the Singhara police in Mahasamund district have seized 7.512 kilograms of gold from a Volkswagen car. The value of the seized gold is estimated to be approximately ₹9.17 crore. The police have arrested three youths in connection with this case.

According to reports, a vehicle inspection drive was being conducted on May 17, 2026, at the Rehtikhol check post located on NH-353. During this operation, a Volkswagen car bearing

registration number GJ 03 NP 4230, approaching from the direction of Odisha, was stopped and subjected to a search. The youths traveling in the car identified themselves as Jayesh Akbari, Sunit, and Rushi Agravat—all residents of Gujarat.

During the search, police discovered two backpacks concealed within a specially constructed secret compartment located beneath the rear seat of the car. Hidden inside six plastic boxes contained within these bags were various types of gold ornaments.

## Public Service Centers in Chhattisgarh Transformed into "Seva-Setu Kendras": Now 442 Digital Services Under One Roof

Raipur . Significantly expanding the framework for delivering digital services to citizens, the State Government has decided to upgrade all operational Public Service Centers across the state and operate them under the new designation of "Seva-Setu Kendras." With this transformation, citizens will now have access to 442 different types of digital citizen services—up from the previous 73—all available on a single, integrated platform.

Previously, Public Service Centers provided 73 distinct services related to certificates, registrations, applications, and government schemes. Following the upgrade, the number of services available at the newly designated Seva-Setu Kendras has surged to 442. This expansion ensures that citizens in both rural and urban areas can access services from various government departments on a unified platform, delivered



in a swift and transparent manner.

The State Government has issued directives to ensure that all Seva-Setu Kendras maintain a uniform identity. As part of this initiative, a new signboard and nameplate will be installed at the main entrance of every center. Furthermore, it is now mandatory to use the term "Seva-Setu Kendra"—along with the prescribed logo—on all promotional materials, digital portals, and receipts, replacing the previous designation of "Public Service Kendra."

The authorized service providers responsible for operating the digital

portals will henceforth be officially designated as "Seva-Setu Managers." This move provides the new operational framework with a distinct institutional identity and greater clarity.

All district administrations have been directed to complete the necessary procedural changes—including the installation of new signboards and nameplates, as well as other improvements—within 15 days. They are required to submit a comprehensive report, accompanied by photographs, upon the completion of these tasks. The District e-Governance Society has been entrusted with the responsibility of undertaking local-level publicity campaigns and disseminating relevant information across various websites.

The State Government firmly believes that this transformative initiative will propel e-governance in the state to unprecedented new heights.

## Public Grievance Redressal Camps Organized in Kurdeg and Remne on May 19

Raipur . Acting under the directives of Chief Minister Shri Vishnu Deo Sai, the continuous organization of public grievance redressal camps under the "Good Governance Festival 2026" (\*Sushasan Tihar\*) is currently underway in Jashpur district.

Through this campaign, the government and the administration are reaching out to every village to ensure the swift resolution of the common citizens' problems. Continuing this initiative, public grievance redressal camps will be organized on May 19, 2026—specifically in the

village of Kurdeg (under the Bagicha Janpad Panchayat) and the village of Remne (under the Manora Janpad Panchayat). At these camps, villagers from the surrounding areas will be able to submit applications regarding their demands and grievances.

The camp in Kurdeg will cater to villagers from Kurdeg, Samarbar, Maini, Durgapara, Sardih, Bimda, Natkela, Jhagarpur, Peta, Jurgum, Bagdol, Khantadand, Jujgu, and Pasiya. Meanwhile, at the Remne camp, villagers from Kardih, Alori,

Talasila, Orkela, Patiya, Remne, Pandarsili, Sonkyari, Gidha, Andharjhar, Baherna, Benjora, Khamhali, Karadari, and Ajdha will be able to submit applications concerning their problems and demands.

Applications received under the "Good Governance Festival" initiative will be scrutinized; eligible cases will be resolved on the spot while the remaining applications will be forwarded to the relevant departments for resolution within a stipulated timeframe.

## Forest Department Launches Major Crackdown on Wild Boar Meat Sales; 14 kg of Meat Seized



Raipur . The Chhattisgarh State Forest Development Corporation is continuously conducting intensive campaigns to curb illegal felling, encroachment, poaching, and mining activities within forest areas. Acting under the directives of Managing Director Mr. Premkumar, regular patrols and surveillance operations are being carried out across all project

divisions within the state. This initiative is already demonstrating a positive impact on forest security. In a significant operation conducted within the Junashahar area of Ratanpur—falling under the Bhaisajhar range of the Kota Project Division (Bilaspur)—the Forest Department uncovered a case involving the illegal

sale of wild boar meat. Acting on a tip-off received from an informant, a raid was conducted yesterday, May 17, at the residence of Suraj Maravi, a resident of Ward No. 15, Junashahar. Following the issuance of a search warrant, the house was thoroughly searched in the presence of Forest Department officials, police personnel, the local Councilor, \*Panch\* (village council members), and residents from the surrounding area. During the operation, 14 kilograms of suspected meat were recovered and subsequently seized by the Forest Department on the spot.

In connection with this incident, a case has been registered under various sections of the Wildlife Protection

Act, 1972, and appropriate legal action has been initiated. Samples of the seized meat have been preserved for laboratory testing, while the remaining meat was safely disposed of in a secure manner at the Central Nursery, Bhaisajhar, under the supervision of senior officials.

This operation was executed under the leadership of Project Range Officer Mr.

Vaibhav Sahu, guided by Regional General Manager Mr. Abhishek Singh and Divisional Manager Mr. Satyadev Sharma. Officers,

field guards, and security personnel of the Forest Department played an active role in the successful execution of this campaign.
