Pak pushes disinformation again to revive debunked claims on Op Sindoor

Some Pakistani elements are using social media to allegedly circulate "misleading and unverified satellite images", falsely claiming strikes on Indian military facilities in Punjab during Operation Sindoor with the aim to "resurrect a failed narrative", people familiar with the matter said.

Independent verification of the locations shown in these images "confirms that no destruction or damage is visible" at the alleged targets, they said on Friday.


The latest social media push relies on unverified imagery and "recycled propaganda", which does not withstand independent scrutiny.

India launched Operation Sindoor last year on May 7 in response to the Pahalgam terror attack, and engaged in a four-day military conflict with Pakistan.

Indian officials and military officers during press briefings then had underlined that they had to also counter a "misinformation campaign".

In a desperate attempt to "resurrect a failed narrative", some Pakistani elements have "once again turned to social media to circulate misleading and unverified satellite images, falsely claiming strikes on Indian military facilities in Punjab during Operation Sindoor," a person familiar with the matter



said. The facts, however, remain unchanged and there is no credible evidence to support claims of Pakistani strikes on Indian military facilities in Punjab during Operation Sindoor, they said.

Indian military facilities

cited in the posts "remain intact, with no signs of blast impact, structural damage, or secondary effects that would be expected from a strike," another person familiar with the matter said.

The sudden appearance of

these visuals seven months later, "without verifiable timestamps, satellite-source details, or corroboration, suggests a post facto attempt to manufacture evidence rather than present genuine documentation," they added.

'Indians travelling to Saudi Arabia need clearance for carrying restricted drugs'

Indians travelling to Saudi Arabia should obtain prior permission for carrying certain "restricted" medicines in and out of the country, as the Kingdom there has introduced a mandatory online clearance system, the NCB said on Friday.

The federal anti-narcotics agency, in a statement, said the General Directorate of Narcotics Control, India Country Office, Saudi Arabia, has formally communicated to it that certain medicines that are legally available in India or other countries may be prohibited or subject to restrictions in the Kingdom.

"It has also been informed that carrying medicines in excess of prescribed limits may also attract regulatory action," the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) said.

The West Asian country has launched an electronic service platform -- with the web address <https://cds.sfd.gov.sa> -- for



submission of applications and related details. Permission can be sought online for the medicines intended to be carried for personal use.

As per the advisory, the NCB said, applications are required to be submitted by those who are travelling or their authorised representatives through the platform.

"Travellers are also advised to consult the official list of restricted and prohibited medicines issued by the Saudi authorities prior to undertaking travel," it said.

The NCB added that Indian travellers are advised to verify the permissibility of medicines they intend to carry and to obtain the requisite approvals, wherever applicable, before travel.

Drugs valued at Rs 20 cr seized at Indo-Pak border; 3 held

Rajasthan Police on Friday arrested three smugglers and seized heroin valued at Rs 20 crore, which was being smuggled into Sri Ganganagar. The official said that the police arrested three smugglers and recovered 4.88 kg of heroin along with the drone.

Sri Ganganagar Superintendent of Police (SP) Amrita Duhan disclosed the details of the smuggling operation during a press conference held at Gharsana police station on Friday. According to the SP, the heroin consignment was sent from Pakistan via drone, which crashed at the same location where the drugs were dropped.

On the night of January 1, a police team from Rawla police station was conducting routine patrols when they spotted three youths behaving suspiciously near the 15 KND culvert on the canal bank. The suspects were carrying a plastic sack. On seeing the police vehicle, they attempted to flee but were quickly surrounded and apprehended.

During the search, police recovered 4 kg 88 grams of heroin packed in three packets and a DJI drone.

The arrested accused have been identified as Jagadeep Singh alias Labbu Singh (26), a resident of Chak 10 K (Anupgarh); Neetu Singh alias Ravneet Singh (21), a resident of Dabli Rathau (Hanumangarh); and Satspal Singh (27), a resident of Chak 04 STR (Gharsana). Police said 1,019 grams of heroin were recovered from Jagadeep Singh, 2,048 grams from Neetu Singh, and 1,021 grams from Satspal Singh.
