

Five including two AIIMS doctors arrested for helping three persons cheat in INI-CET

The police arrested five persons including two doctors in Rishikesh for allegedly aiding three candidates in cheating during the Institute of National Importance Combined Entrance Test (INI-CET) conducted by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences

informed that the INI-CET is a national-level entrance test conducted twice a year by AIIMS for admissions to postgraduate courses like Doctor of Medicine (MD). The test was conducted across the country on May 19 and the police received confidential information that

ed the investigation and found five men sitting in a car near Barrage Road, who were allegedly sending answers to the question papers of the entrance test to the three candidates using mobile phones and tablets. The candidates in question were taking the test at the

Kashyap (23). All the accused belong to Haryana except Kashyap who hails from Punjab. The police also recovered three tablets, three mobile phones, two medical books and a luxury car from the possession of the accused. Singh said that according to the main accused Ajit, they had hired two doctors Aman and Vaibhav from AIIMS-Rishikesh for Rs two lakh each to provide answers to the questions papers. The candidates from Kangra were sending photos of the question papers from the examination centres and the gang was sending the answers through a Telegram group. Ajit revealed during interrogation that he has three labs through which he helps candidates cheat in several other competitive examinations in exchange for a huge amount of money. The SSP said that the police are investigating the gang as it has been facilitating cheating in several examinations across the country. The police have also found admit cards and other details of the three candidates and will take action accordingly, he added.

Two die, three injured after vehicle falls into gorge in Rajpur

Two persons died and three sustained serious injuries after the car they were travelling in fell into a gorge near Shikhar Fall in the Rajpur area on Monday morning. The officials informed that the

two deceased were identified as Dehradun resident merchant navy officer Ayush Sharma (30) and a cafe operator on Mussoorie Road, Avni Kukreti (29) who lived in Dulwanala area. The injured



Rajpur police station received information about a vehicle falling into a gorge at Shikhar Fall around 3 AM. A police team reached the accident spot and called the search and rescue team of the State Disaster Rescue Force (SDRF) to start the rescue and relief operation. The SDRF with the help of the police and local people pulled out five persons from the gorge after considerable effort. The police found out that two persons had died on the spot and the remaining three were admitted to the hospital for treatment. The

persons include two Dehradun residents Yuvraj Bisht (33) and Isha (28) and a Delhi resident Sagar Narula (30). The officials informed that Bisht and Narula were admitted to the Max Hospital and Isha was admitted to the Deen Dayal Upadhyay (Coronation) Hospital. The officials said that according to the injured victims, they had come to Shikhar Fall for sightseeing in their vehicle but when they were returning home, the brakes failed and the vehicle fell into the gorge.

Govt asks departments to give benefit of relaxation in promotions to employees

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The State government has directed all the departments to complete the process of promotions of employees eligible under the benefit of one time relaxation in the norms. In a letter to all the secretaries, commissioners, heads of departments and district magistrates, the additional chief secretary Anand Bardhan said that the State government on December 29, 2023 had notified a relaxation (amendment) regulation - 2023 according to which the eligible employees will be given benefit of relaxation in promotion norms between July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. The relaxation will be given to the employees only when all their senior employees have got promoted so that there is no disparity in cadre man-

agement. In his letter, the ACS said that it is observed that in many departments the process of promotion is being delayed. He said that a time of less than one and half month is remaining for promotion on relaxation of norms and eligible employees should not remain deprived from promotions.

Expressing happiness at the order of the ACS, the president of the State employees' joint federation, Arun Pandey said that the promotion process of the employees should not get delayed. He demanded that the State government should take strict action against the departments showing negligence in the process of promotion.

Relief from heat wave conditions forecast today

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The maximum and minimum temperatures remained a few degrees above normal in the plains and in some mountainous regions even as some mountainous regions received light to moderate rain on Monday. The mercury level is expected to get slightly lower today. The State meteorological centre forecast that very light to light rain/thunderstorms are likely to occur at isolated places in Uttarkashi, Chamoli, Rudrapur, Bageshwar, Pithoragarh, Almora and Champawat districts today while dry weather is likely to prevail in the remaining districts. The meteorological centre has also issued a yellow warning (Watch) regarding the possibility of thunderstorms accompanied with lightning/gusty wind (30-40 kmph) likely to occur at isolated places in above-mentioned districts of

Uttarakhand. The provisional State capital Dehradun is forecast to witness a mainly clear to partly cloudy sky. The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to be about 39 degrees Celsius and 23 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun on Tuesday.

The maximum and minimum temperatures recorded on Monday were 40 degrees Celsius and 23.5 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun, 39.5 degrees Celsius and 24.7 degrees Celsius in Pantnagar, 29.1 degrees Celsius and 13.1 degrees Celsius in Mukteshwar and 28.5 degrees Celsius and 14.1 degrees Celsius in New Tehri. There was 19.5 millimetres rain in Rikhnikhah, 17.5 millimetres in Ukhimath, 13.5 millimetres in Agastyanuni, 12 millimetres in Jakholi and five millimetres in Champawat.

Increased traffic causes issues for Rajpur Road residents

Residents of Rajpur Road who live along the stretch from Mussoorie Diversion to old Rajpur Road have expressed their concern over the increased traffic, particularly during the weekends. The rush of tourists to Mussoorie on the weekend and the increased traffic of visitors to this destination with the start of the Char Dham Yatra are posing issues for residents of this area. They claimed that the living environment in the Rajpur Road area has been significantly impacted by the increased traffic and disruptive activities of commuters, adversely affecting local residents. The residents of Rajpur Road urged the administration to restrict heavy traffic diversion in the area during weekends. Virat Pahwa, who owns an automobile shop in the Rajpur Road area, said that during weekends, increased traffic can be observed in the Rajpur Road area as compared to other areas of the city. He said that in addition to the traffic, the visitors play loud music and litter which spoils the condition of Rajpur Road and affects the living atmosphere and health of local residents. A senior citizen living in the old Rajpur Road area Sunita Bindra stated, "The increased traffic has greatly affected elderly people like me. Due to the increased traffic, especially on weekends, we are unable to

go for a walk." She also expressed concern that the tourist season, with visitors heading to Mussoorie and other areas, will further disrupt their evening walks and lead to noise and air pollution. She further added that the administration must consider diverting heavy traffic to other areas instead of Rajpur Road. For safety reasons, especially during the tourist season, the police administration must increase patrolling in the Rajpur Road area, she said.

The founding president of the Rajpur Community Initiative, Reenu Paul stated that the increased traffic has led to the police administration diverting heavy traffic, especially in the Rajpur Road area. Local residents have been expressing concerns about the increased traffic and the nuisance they suffer during the tourist season for many years, but the authorities have not taken any action so far. Further, she highlighted that half of the people in the Rajpur Road area are senior citizens, mostly affected by the increased traffic. She suggested that the police and administration should

look into diverting heavy traffic during weekends. Additionally, the government should consider limiting the number of tourists in the city, as the increased traffic not only causes chaos but also affects the people, she said.
